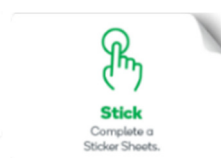

In reading, we will be looking at the character traits of different characters. Miss Waite's grade will be looking at writing good sentences, as this week they made some criteria for what makes a good sentence.

We will be completing some activities around the author Roald Dahl as it is Roald Dahl day on Wednesday. We will also be following a procedure to make an invention.



During our Library session we will be working on making our simple machines. This week students made a plan for what they are going to build.

In maths, we will have a focus on problem solving. We will be learning about using strategies such as 'act out a problem', 'draw a picture' or 'make a model' to solve division worded problems.

In the last week of term on Monday we will be making cupcakes in the Art Room. If you would like to help, please see Miss Stockdale or Miss Waite.

A friendly reminder to ensure your child has a named hat at school as we find many hats with no names. When hats have no names it makes our job difficult to find the right owner of the hat!

Grades 2/3 Preview – Week 9

The end of the term is coming at us with a rush, with less than two weeks now until the Grade 2 Sleepover. Please remember to have all forms back to school by Tuesday 12th September.

In Reading and Writing next week, we will continue to explore how dictionaries, thesauruses and glossaries can be used to help us expand our vocabulary. The students have really taken on board the challenge of navigating the dictionary and finding out the meaning of new and interesting words.



We will also be publishing our narrative and procedural texts – using text and visual features such as headings, bold writing, text boxes and illustrations, to make our writing more appealing for our audience.

In Maths, we are focussing on solving word-based problems using the four operations. When solving problems students will be supported to follow a four-step process:

- 1 Understand the problem – What is the problem asking me to do?
- 2 Plan to solve it – Choose a strategy.
- 3 Implement the plan – Solve the problem and check your answer.
- 4 Reflect on the problem – Is my answer reasonable? Can I check another way? Was my strategy successful? Was my strategy efficient?

In our recent Problem Solving Common Assessment Task, it was found that many students struggled to solve problems involving money. To support your child to deepen their understanding of money, it would be great if you could involve your child in practical money sense activities: eg - Count how much money is in their 'piggy bank' and work out how much more to get to a certain milestone, like \$10.

- Help with budgeting and shopping at the supermarket.

- Ask questions like: I have 50c in my pocket – What coins might I have?

In Inquiry, we will be working towards completing our Design Briefs – Making a toy or game that incorporates at least one simple machine. Students may need to try to source some materials at home to help them complete their projects. Resilience is likely to play a major role, as students endeavour to transfer their ideas from the plan to real-life.

Hope you all manage to stay warm and dry on the weekend, and that your footy team wins (especially if they are the Swans or the Tigers!),

In Mathematics we will be reviewing topics covered this term: We will continue to focus on fractions, time including elapsed time, ratios and worded problems.

Our focus in Writing will be apostrophes of possession and Information Reports. Students must read at least four times a week. Please monitor your child's reading. If this is not happening, make a time to ensure your child reads. Most students have added their new spelling words on SeeSaw. Please help your child learn their words. If your child has not uploaded their words, encourage them to do so at home or please message their teacher so this can be rectified at school.
