Grade 2/3 Preview – Week 6

We are looking forward to a fun-packed Education Week next week. Please feel free to drop in during our Open Mornings any day to join in with our regular classroom sessions.

In Reading and Writing next week we will continue to expand our vocabulary by finding and using more interesting words. We will also begin to explore poetry in its many different forms. If you have any poetry books or favourite poems at home, it would be great if you could share them with your child.

In Mathematics we will revisit and dig more deeply into the topic of time, with students setting their own individual learning goals and working towards achieving them. The more practise students can get with reading and interpreting time at home, the greater their chances of reaching these goals. Spelling: To assist your child with the words we are studying, please ask which sound and letter combinations we are focusing on – either “sh” or double letters within a word

Maths: This week we are studying Chance and Data. This also involves Probability- the likelihood of an event / outcome happening or not. If you have dice at home, you could practice writing the chances of certain numbers being rolled more or less depending on the type of dice (6,9,12 sided) and how many dice are rolled at the same time. Work out why certain numbers are appearing more often.

Reading: As part of Education Week, we are participating in the National Simultaneous Story Time activity reading the book “The Cow Tripped over the Moon” based on perseverance and one of our school values resilience. Students continue working in groups based on their particular learning needs. Please ensure your child is reading regularly. Take some time to discuss the book they are reading. Let us know if your child does not have an appropriate reading book and we will make sure they borrow an interesting book from the school.

Writing: Students will be writing a narrative or poem for the Churchill News Story Competition concentrating on punctuation, grammar and interesting sentence “openers”. Discuss with your child interesting ways they can begin sentences that grab the reader’s attention.

Our classrooms are open for a visit each morning during Education Week and there are special whole school house science activities rotations led by our senior student leadership team on Friday morning. Please come in and interact with your child and other students during the week.
