Next week in class we will be beginning work on persuasive texts. We will be reading books that try to persuade and begin to write persuasive writing pieces. **In reading** we have been focusing on giving opinions and reasons and we will continue with this next week. **In maths**, we will be covering the topics of place value, subtraction and looking at calendars. **In Inquiry** we will be looking at places in our community.

Grade 2 and Grade 3 families!


Good Afternoon Grade 2 and Grade 3 Parents and Families.

Here is what we will be looking at in Week 4:

Inquiry: We will be practising asking open and closed questions in order to prepare to gather information about countries that are on the continents Asia, Africa and South America. To create open and closed questions it will be important to remember what we know about the continents in terms of their geographical features, the climate, flora and fauna. I wonder if some of the animals native to Africa would be able to survive in the wild in Asia or South America? What kind of habitats could they survive in? What is unique about the animals that would allow them to survive on another continent?

Mathematics: Next week we will continue practising identifying, naming and creating fractions by using number lines and collections of objects. If a whole group is divided into four equal parts, then it has been divided into quarters or $\frac{4}{4}$. This is the denominator or number at the bottom of a fraction. The numerator is the number above the line of a fraction. If we take away one of the four equal parts, then we are left with three out of four parts, or $\frac{3}{4}$. You can support your child to apply this to collections of object by placing each equal group into a container of the same size. Ask your child to practise dividing 20 pieces of pasta into four containers evenly.

Reading: Our focus this week is developing our comprehension of non-fiction texts. The strategies we will be focussing on will be using key words and the main idea of a text. If the subtitle in a book about the lifecycle of a giraffe says "*Predators*", then the information in that section will be about the animals that hunt the giraffe for food. If you have access to non-fiction texts at home, practise making predictions about what information you will find in a section of the text and then reading to find out if your prediction was confirmed. If you don't have a lot of non-fiction texts at home but you have access to the



internet, check out the National Geographic website page for Blue Whales - <https://www.natgeokids.com/au/discover/animals/sea-life/10-blue-whale-facts/>. The fact headings at the beginning of the page are a quick example of how subtitles can help you find specific information.



Writing: This week we will continue developing our report writing skills through improving our note taking skills and our own use of non-fiction text features. Reading and Writing will intertwine this week in order to provide a comprehensive learning experience about non-fiction texts.
