Our early Parent/ Teacher conversations are due to take place on Wednesday 14th March. After our assessment program to begin the year and after parents have had a chance to listen to staff about how the classrooms work and basic expectations it is now time to catch up with parents to discuss individual children's needs. Our Parent/Teacher conversations are a good chance for this to happen. Please check your child's bag for the booking form and information (Yellow paper) and return as soon as possible. If you have recently had or been having conversations with your child's teacher then there may not be a need for you to have these conversations.

We have been investigating the replacement/fixing of our popular sandpit area. At School Council we have discussed the need for shade over the sand pit area and for the area to be structural sound as at present on wall is falling away a bit. We are currently gathering quotes for this work and Parents Club fundraising will also go towards this project.

F/1AJ & F/1/M Preview

Next week, will begin our Inquiry on 'My History', starting with our families. At home, you could discuss who the members of your family are, where they live and where they come from. Please look out for some homework tasks related to our topic over the coming weeks, and assist your child to answer the questions, so that they are prepared to participate in discussions and activities at school.

In Maths, we will continue to explore the four seasons, and the months of the year. Perhaps you could discuss the months that are in each season, and the things your family does in different seasons. For example, what times of the year do you collect firewood, go on holidays, collect mushrooms, etc?

In Literacy, we will be revising the letters and sounds introduced so far and explore how these sounds can be put together to make words. To support your Foundation child, encourage them to practise the words and letters in their folders. Grade One students should practise reading with fluency and expression, by taking notice of the punctuation marks, and thinking about what is happening in the story.

At school, we have been focussing on our school value of responsibility. At home, you might like to talk about the responsibilities different people in your household have.

We are excited to welcome Mrs Denise Vesty back to HNPS. She will be working two days a week in the F/1/2/3 classes, providing extra support in the area of literacy.

Old Gipps town Excursion permission notes have been distributed. Please sign and return with payment as soon as possible, particularly if you are interested in being a parent helper on the day.

Preview 2/3

It is fantastic to see so many parents already logging on to Seesaw and viewing their child's learning! Our focus is on specific feedback and one of the things to keep in mind, which can make giving feedback easier, is commenting about what you *notice*. For example *I noticed that you did...really well. Have you thought about doing...next time?*

Reading: There will be a focus on our reading accuracy next week. One of the Café strategies that can assist this is cross-checking: "*Does it look right?*", "*Does it sound right?*" and "*Does it make sense?*" Try using a feedback starter such as "*I noticed you said...when the first letter is...*". "*Does that look right, sound right or make sense?*"

Maths: Next week in Maths, we will be developing our place value understanding while learning more about measurement. A simple way to find out what your child knows is to roll a dice to create one, two, three, four digit numbers and asking your child to accurately read it aloud. There are also plenty of ideas online: <https://mathgeekmama.com/best-math-card-games/>.

Writing: In Writing, we will be looking at using paragraphs to help organise our writing pieces. Students need to remember that the information in the first sentence of a paragraph needs to be directly related to the information written in the paragraph, otherwise it can get very confusing!

Inquiry: This week a notice has been sent home for the Old Gipps town Excursion on the 15th March in Moe. This excursion will help students to develop their understanding of the difference in daily life over the years. Grade 2 students will also be bringing home interview questions to ask you or your extended family about your own family histories. The due date for this is Monday 5th March.

Writing

Next week I will be continuing to work on drafting a narrative story. I will be setting goals using my Writing Checklist.

Maths

In Maths, I will be completing activities around the topic of Data representation. This will involve asking questions, collecting information and graphing data. I will interpret and answer questions about the data I have collected. I will have the opportunity to create various graphs; including picture, bar and pie graphs. At home, I could practise putting information into a graph.

Reading

This week our teachers' finished our reading assessments. Next week I will be focusing on my next level of learning during Reading Conferences. I will ensure I read at least 4 times this week and ask my parents to question me deeply about what I have read. I will remember to get a parent to sign off on my daily reading.

Inquiry

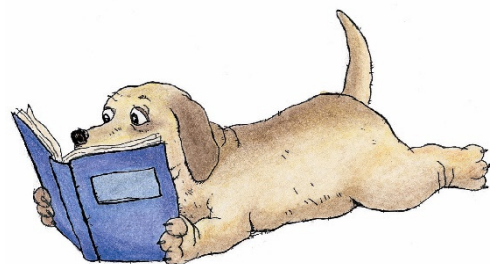
I will be continuing to engage with our new Inquiry topic based on Australian History. I will be working on identifying my area of interest (First Fleet, Explorers, Indigenous Australians) and continue to refine my questions about my area of interest. I will be working on a timeline to organise when I will complete parts of this project. We can talk about the major events which formed our history – particularly early European settlement and the effect on our aboriginal population.
