## **PRINCIPAL COMMENTS: PAUL JORGENSEN**

Recently School council wrote a letter to politicians regarding the state of our old buildings. Melina Bath, Member for Gippsland, and some news reporters, visited us. Some of you may have seen the item on either Win local news or Nine local news.

During this time, we were able to raise our concern about the state of our old buildings that we believe are in need of some major repairs or replacing. We do spend all of the money we receive for maintenance at our school but the jobs that are required would add up to considerably more than we get in our budget.

There has been considerable money spent in the past few years building the new Morwell Central School and rebuilding Morwell Park School. There has also been a promise of money to Churchill Primary school. These works are all needed works and are great for those school communities. Our School Council felt that perhaps we are being overlooked and we wanted to highlight that we are also in need of additional money to bring our school into the 21<sup>st</sup> Century with regards to buildings. The old buildings are outdated, falling apart and are not ideal for modern teaching and learning needs.

Currently we are budgeting to try to make some of the necessary repairs, but we also did not want to spend a lot of money on a building that may actually require replacing therefore wasting that money.

We will need to wait for some type of outcome, as Melina Bath will raise the issue in parliament in the near future.
