On Monday, staff worked on further developing our Reading strategies across the school and on developing our whole school curriculum planning documents. 56.00 Breaststroke

53.65 Backstroke

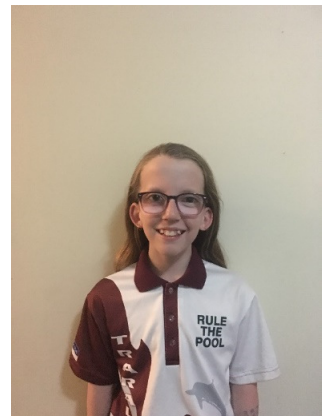
I found out that now I have got my national times I can swim all around Australia!.
