HNPS VISUAL ARTS GALLERY TERM 2

It has been a busy and productive term in the Art Room with many fabulous artworks created by the talented HNPS artists! Students have explored colour and line, incorporating these art elements into a variety of artworks inspired by famous artists, the winter season, everyday life, special events and the environment. Years 4/5/6 students have worked hard to create a 3D Fish sculpture. The fish started out as a recycled plastic water bottle. Fins, eyes and a tail were attached to the bottle, then layers of tissue paper applied. Students used their colour and line knowledge to draw intricate details on the fish using paint markers. The fish are suspended on a plaster stand, which was also decorated. Throughout the project, students regularly gave and received peer feedback. Challenges arose; resilience and problem solving skills were required. The students were involved in the assessment process, contributing ideas to an Assessment Rubric. I have been extremely proud of the way the year 4/5/6 students worked and as you can see below, the finished Fish Sculptures look amazing! We are planning to hold an Art Show at school later on in the year to showcase all the children's artworks; please keep an eye out for further details next term.

P.E: OVERVIEW OF SEMESTER 1

Because the report comments were fairly concise this year, I felt that an elaboration on what 'skills' mean would help in understanding your children's comments further.

The Victorian Health and Physical Education Curriculum aims to:

- promote the importance of students being able to participate in a range of physical activities across their lives,
- assist students to use personal, social, behavioural, and cognitive skills and strategies to promote a sense of personal identity and well-being,
- help students build and manage respectful relationships.

This underlies the lesson structure of P.E. at Hazelwood North Primary, involving a consistent focus on student growth in attitude as well as on physical skills. This includes encouraging growth mindsets, with the understanding that individuals are not born knowing how to succeed in a sport, and that practise and persistence will result in improvement. Students have been encouraged to consider their own level of challenge when practising physical skills, and to set achievable goals including their 10minute runs, circuit skills, the Beep Test, attitude, and specific sporting aims.

Term 1 mainly consisted of practise for the District Athletics Day, which culminated in a second placing. Term 2 consisted of activities that involved spatial awareness, football and hockey skills, and an emphasis on being able to give and take constructive feedback.

In addition, the Year Foundation/1 focus was on resilience and being positive members of a team. Students explored this earlier in the year by playing traditional Vietnamese games such as Dragon and Snake, and Tug-of-War. They also practised football skills, skipping, bouncing and passing basketballs.

The older students practised skills such as footy handballing, kicking and bouncing, as well as revisiting hockey skills from last year. They also participated in clinics for hockey, football, and netball.
