Along with this staff are currently completing the Staff Opinion Surveys. Beginning next week the Parent Opinion Survey will run. Our response rates from students and staff have been very good in recent years but the response rate from parents has been low.

This year there will be 60 families asked to complete the online survey. These families are randomly generated through the Departments CASES21 system. If you receive an email with the request to complete the survey we ask that you please take part as we use all the survey information gathered to ensure that we continue to provide the best education we can for your children.

We currently have six students attending Somers School Camp. This 9 day camp provides children with many challenges and rewarding experiences. We look forward to the children returning from the camp with lots of exciting stories about

their adventure. We will also have some children attend the 3 day sports camp later this year. The selection process has already begun for this activity but those lucky enough to be chosen to attend has not been completed as yet.
