Please see the following reminders and important information for families:

### New Building and Construction Works

As you would have seen on social media and at school, our old administration building has now been demolished. Our students have been wonderful in respecting the safety procedures around the construction site and have also enjoyed opportunities to watch the demolition in progress! This means that work is able to continue over the coming weeks, which will mean more trucks needing access to the building site. When this is underway, we will have a traffic controller operating the internal gates at times when students require access to the Art room and Hall for specialist classes. Thank you to everyone for your understanding during this time.

### Drop Off Zone & Pedestrian Access

Thank you to parents and carers who have been respectful of our altered pick up and drop off procedures during the building works. Unfortunately there have been a number of incidents that continue to pose a safety risk. Please note the following guidelines that we require families to follow:

- Students and parents/carers must stay behind the flagged areas when entering and exiting the school.
- The only pick up point after school is at the far end of the flags in the bus loop, where a staff member will be monitoring. If you reach the front of the queue and your child is not present, please do another loop of the carpark to avoid holding up traffic.
- Students and families are NOT permitted to cut across the carpark unattended or through the flags at any point. If you are parked in the car park inside the bus loop, please let a staff member on duty know and they will escort you through traffic.

These measures are in place solely to keep both students and families safe. Staff on duty are required to implement these requirements, so please ensure we communicate respectfully.
