Principal News

Grade Structure and Staffing

We will have a few changes in our senior end with Miss Cross leaving and our other two grades already being covered by CRTs. We have recently appointed two new staff to the school who will be working in this area. We are excited to announce that Ms Nicola Hoekstra and Mr Connor Murphy will be joining our team and are bringing their experience and enthusiasm to HNPS. Ms Hoekstra is already known to most of the students, having worked some CRT days across the school this year. Some students may remember Mr Murphy who worked as a pre-service teacher with Mr Simmons a few years ago.

Our structure for the grades is also still up in the air a little. We are still to confirm if we will be running 7 or 8 grades across the school. This is due to a combination of lower enrolment numbers for 2024 and the ability to attract staff to positions, a problem across the state. Either way, the junior end will be as follows: $2 \times F/1$ and $2 \times 1/2$. Our senior end will either be $2 \times 3/4$ and $2 \times 5/6$; or a grade 3, 4/5 and 5/6.

2024 Transition Day – 12th December

On this day students get the exciting opportunity to step up and spend the morning in the grade level they will be in next year. It is hoped that students will be spending this time with their actual teacher and grade for 2024, however there may be some fine tuning after this time to finalise everything.
