# **Principal News**

It has been wonderful having such lovely weather for the students to enjoy our playground, ga ga ball pit and basketball court. Thank you to the 3 parents who have self-nominated for School Council this year. As we have the exact number of nominations as positions open, an election is not required. I will announce our new school council members after the AGM in March.

#### Indigenous History Session – Grade 3-6

Last week Andy our ES organised for Laurie Marx to come and talk to our grade 3-6 students. Laurie discussed respect and held students accountable to modelling this across our school. He provided the students with a brief enlightening into the First Nation Peoples' experiences during and since colonisation. He touched on a few significant historical happenings, such as the Stolen Generation where he shared his direct experiences and how it has impacted him. He explained that lack of equality experienced by First Nations People and made it clear that until the 1970's they were recognised as 'flora and fauna' (aka plants and animals) rather than people, which was quite a confronting shock for the students. Students were further shocked when Laurie showed them an advertisement featuring a photograph of a children lined up 'for sale', one of which had a cross marked on the chest (a sign of purchase) because they looked the 'least' indigenous. Students were all captivated by him and his presentation and they got the opportunity to questions.

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


# **Parents & Friends Club**
